

DESCRIPTION OF “LANGUAGE ON THE GO” ACTIVITIES



1. Fine Arts Museum

Students will visit the museum's permanent collection. The museum is the largest museum in Canada. The instructor will include a scavenger hunt activity to make the visit a lot more fun and interactive. The museum is known for its innovative exhibitions that combine a variety of artistic disciplines; art, music, film, fashion and design. The five different pavilions include international art, world cultures, decorative arts as well as local Quebec, Canadian and a selection of Inuit art.



2. Tour of Little Italy

Students discover the enchanting neighborhood of Little Italy. The tour includes a culinary segment visiting one of the largest outdoor food markets in Canada, the Jean-Talon market. Students will have a chance to sample local flavors while touring the streets, churches, parks and shops that make up Little Italy.



3. Visit to MATv

MATv is a community television station powered by Videotron. Students will visit the station to learn about the mission of community television programming while learning about the mosaic of cultures that make up Montreal. They will see what it is like to sit at the anchor's desk and behind the camera as well.



4. Montreal City Tour

This tour leads the students through the streets of downtown Montreal as well as the Underground city which measures 33 km in length. The students will be introduced to a network of interior galleries, tunnels, boutiques, restaurants, condominiums and underground passageways that lead to the metro system. Montreal's downtown is both the heart of the city and one of the most vibrant and cosmopolitan areas. The students will discover the city and learn about its history.



5. Coding Workshop at the Apple Store

Students will venture downtown to Montreal's iconic Ste-Catherine Street to visit our stunning Apple store. During the visit, students will learn how to code their very own app using Swift – a powerful programming language created by Apple. iPads will be provided to all students participating in the activity.



6. Photography and Video Workshop at the Apple Store

Students will learn essential photo skills, experiment with portraiture and even break the rules for more artful photos. Students will be given Apple products; tablets or phone to use during the activity.

Students will also explore storytelling secrets and editing magic with the immersive sessions that will teach the students how to bring their videos to life. Apple also offers workshops in music, Art and Design, Health and Fitness.



7. City Hall Tour

Students will get to experience the beauty and history of politics in Montreal on this guided tour of our city hall. They will even get a chance to sit at the mayor of Montreal's desk and ask the staff questions about the mayor's role.



8. Montreal History Museum

Students will visit the Montreal History Museum. The museum's mission is to help visitors discover and understand today's city and its diverse heritage by showing how the history of those who have lived and still live in Montreal have shaped the urban environment and defines its identity.



9. MAC and Art Workshop

Students will participate in a guided tour of Montreal's stunning Museum of Contemporary Arts followed by a contemporary art workshop.



10. Tour of Quartier des Spectacles

Students will receive a guided tour of Montreal's famous Quartier des Spectacles. The tour guide will provide history and interesting facts about the lively entertainment district.



11. Street Art Tour

Montreal is known around the world for its breathtaking street art. During this guided tour, students will take in some of the captivating murals along St. Laurent Boulevard, allowing them to experience the creative side of Montreal.



12. McGill University Tour

Students will get a guided tour of the University. The Downtown campus tour begins at the Welcome center where students will find information about undergraduate admissions, programs of study and more. A current McGill student will lead the tour and speak about the buildings, life in residence, student services, library resources and clubs and societies.



13. Hospital Tour

Students visit the Shriners' Hospital for Children Canada. It is the only Shriner's Hospital in Canada. The students are given a tour of every floor. Each floor was designed to represent the different regions of Canada. The regions include British Columbia, the Saint Lawrence Valley, the Prairies, the Rockies, The Atlantic provinces, the Arctic and finally the cafeteria represents the urban cities across Canada. The Shriner's Hospital is dedicated to improving the lives of children by providing paediatric speciality care, conducting innovative research and offering educational programs for medical professionals. The students are shown the research labs, the rehabilitation center, the educational facilities as well as the rooms.



14. World Trade Center

Students will get a tour of the financial district and visit Montreal's World Trade Center that is located in a shopping complex. They will also visit the Bank of Montreal, the oldest bank in Montreal.



15. Leonardo Davinci and Greene Community Centers

Students will visit community centers to get a tour of all the services and activities offered to the Montreal community. The Leonardo Davinci center also offers fitness and nutrition counselling that will be included in the tour.



16. Tour of Dawson's Sustainability Programme

Students are given a tour of the Dawson College campus grounds. Students will learn about Dawson College's Sustainability initiative as it provides opportunities for experimental, global and community-based learning, collaboration, research and connection with nature.



17. Neighborhood Tours

Students will be given tours of the different Montreal neighborhoods;

18. Central Station

Students will visit the Gare Centrale located in Place Ville Marie, the tallest building in Montreal. Students will get a tour of the station and will practice asking about fares, destinations and other travel information.
