Brisbane is Australia's third largest city and the capital of Queensland. It is a buzzing city with lots to do and is rightly famous for its amazing climate that is near perfect all year round. Its proximity to many of Queensland's major tourist destinations has helped make it into a Mecca for visitors to Australia. CLIMATE

Brisbane has a humid subtropical climate with year-round warm to hot temperatures and around 300 days of sunshine per year. Brisbane experiences an annual mean minimum of 16.6 °C (62 °F) and a mean maximum of 26.6 °C (80 °F), making it Australia's second-hottest capital city. Seasonality is not pronounced, and average maximum temperatures of above 26 °C (79 °F) persist from October through to April. Due to its proximity to the Coral Sea of the Pacific Ocean and a warm ocean current, Brisbane's overall temperature variability is somewhat less than most Australian capitals.

HEALTH & INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Australia has a special health insurance coverage for international students called Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC). OSHC is insurance designed to help international students cover the costs of medical and hospital care that they may need while in Australia. Because of these requirements, it is important that international students purchase their Australian international student health insurance prior to departing their home country. Belgians students do not need to purchase OSHC since they are covered under the Reciprocal Health Care Agreement. Swedish students do not need to purchase OSHC since they are covered under the National Board of Student Air or by Kammarkollegiet. If not covered by either, then Swedish international students will need to purchase OSHC. Norwegian students do not need to purchase OSHC since they are covered under the Norwegian National Insurance Scheme.

DRIVING AGE

The driving age in Australia is 17 years. A learner can drive at the age of 16 under the supervision of a fully licensed driver. After obtaining a licence, a driver continues to be subject to restrictions during a 2-year probationary period.

ALCOHOL AGE

It is illegal for any person under the age of 18 years to purchase, supply, or drink alcohol on licensed or regulated premises, even if they are with their parents or guardian.

SMOKING LAWS

Brisbane has very strict local laws on smoking. Current laws prohibit smoking anywhere inside pubs, clubs, hotels, restaurants and workplaces and outdoor public places, including the Queen Street Mall, playgrounds, beaches, sports stadiums and within 4 metres of non-residential building entrances.

TAP WATER - DRINKABLE!

Brisbane tap water has been deemed as safe drinking water. Bottled water is also available from corner stores, petrol stations, supermarkets, and sometimes chemists (drug store) and news agencies.
